10. Sec. 8, Schedule B, was intended to apply to those agents who make it a business (not exclusive, into in the nature of a regular business) to deal for brokers. A person acting unwittingly for a broker, or making a single purchase or insignificant number of purchases, in ignorance of the law, might conscientionally decline to pay the tax. Do minimus non-curatics. This exposition is perhaps more favorable to the agent than the words of the law admit, but is believed to be the spirit.

PATENT MEDICINES. 11. Under Sec. 24, School, B., Reyenne Act, if A sells patent medicines to B and B sells the same to C, both A, and B, pay ten per cent, on the sales, and so on, each seller must pay ten per cent.

OF SH PIERRANT BOOK MELLINA, Hall helt berei 12. Persons selling books, maps, &c., as agents of others, from county to county, do not pay as peddiars or merchants, but their profits, if equal to \$500, must be listed as "income."

PEDDLEES.

13. If a merchant opens a store in a town, bong fide 13. If a merchant opens a store in a town, Jona jase intending to adopt it as a permanent location, he is not to be deemed as a peddler under proviso (2) sec. 27 of the Revenue act, even if, from disappointment in his expectations, he shortly removes his goods. If the merchant opens store with the intent to remove his goods, which intent is carried into effect when the first rush of business is over, and when he thinks he can sell more profitably elsewhere, he is deemed a peddler. The Sheriff must decide each ease according to the facts:
