Finally, Court was about to adjourn, and she, as a matter of course, applied for her witness ticket. It was found that the case was not on the Docket! And this poor woman, with nothing at home to feed her starving children upon, was obliged, after losing her witness fees, her time, and her rations attending Court, to trudge her way back to them as best she could, and all because of ignorance or inexcusable neglect of an important duty.
