THREE MILLION MORE OF BONDS FOR GERMANY.

WASHINGTON, October 28.—Noon.—Secretary Richardson's order to Treasurer Spinner, directing the payment of silver, is as follows: "You will please on and after the receipt of this letter, and until otherwise ordered, pay the public creditors, should they desire it, on account of currency obligations, but not in exchange for currency, a sum not to exceed five dollars in any one payment in silver coin."
