Singerly's State Printing and State Journal Office, five stories high, is in fames and will be entirely destroyed. The operatives barely escaped with their lives. Several lives are reported lost. The Lochiel hotel is in great danger.

HARREBURG, Nov. 5-Night.-Sinlestroyed. From 250 to 300 persons were employed in the upper stories. So rapid was the fire that many had to fell to the ground. Nothing was saved from the contents. The last three day's proceedings of the Constitational Convention, extra copies of the Convention proceedings and a thousand volumes belonging to the State Library, were all burned. The presses and machinery were a total loss. The State Journal office, in the same building, was also destroyed. Singerley's loss will reach \$100,000, 65 Republican Assemblymen sure and with no insurance. The fire spread to three frame buildings. Several stables and the Lochiel House were somewhat damaged. The falling walls struck a brick house on the opposite side of the street, damaging it very seriously.

TWEED'S CASE AGAIN IN COURT.

#### SHANKS DISCHARGED ON HABEAS COBPUS.

NEW YORK, November 5-Night --When the case of Wm. M. Tweed was called in the Court of Oyer and Terminer to-day, his counsel handed Judge Davis a paper, which was understood to be a protest against that Judge presiding at the trial. Judge Davis characterized the contents of the paper and the time of presenting it as extraordinary, and adjourned the Court till he could consult with his Associate Justices of this district.

Judge Faucher, to-day, after hearing arguments in the Shanks habeas corpus case, rendered a decision. He holds that, first, the commitment under which Shanks was held in Kings county was illegal, it being for an indefinite period, while the statute which is above the Court that issued the order, limits punishment to 30 days; second, that the commitment which was executed the day after Shanks' imprisonment, cannot legalize an ex-isting imprisonment. The Brooklyn Court commitment declares it adjudged him guilty of criminal contempt, but they cannot first imprison the man and then adjudge him guilty, ex post facto. The paper of the second commitment he regards as of no validity and the first one as illegal. The petitioner was accordingly discharged.


