SPAIN WILL CONCEDE ALL WE HAVE ASKED.

THE ORDER OF THE HOME GOV-ERNMENT WILL BE CAR-RIED OUT IN CUBA.

POOR CUBA WILL NOT BE FREE AFTER ALL.

THE PROTOCOL BETWEEN FISH AND POLO.

New York, Nov. 29-Noon. double leaded editorial in the Times, of this morning, treats of peace as a foregone conclusion, and praises what it calls the good temper and tact of Admiral Polo and Secretary Fish, in having effected it. It reads: There can be no impropriety in mentioning that Admiral Polo has endeavored by all honorable means to bring about a peaceable solution, without forgetting, for a moment, the claims of his coun-

The Herald's dispatch says that Secretary Fish has no doubt but that the Spanish Government will be able to enforce the order restoring the Virginius to the United States. Colonial Minister Solor, who is now in Havana, will personally see that the orders of the home Government are promptly carried out.

All the Washington speceials in the morning papers unite in asserting that Spain has conceded to our demands and peace is assurred.

The Tribune's dispatch says : The dispatch deciding the grave question whether there shall be peace or war between the United States and Spain was received by Mr. Fish to-night and communicated to the President and Cabinet. It is of the most satisfactory character, and concedes all the demands made by the United States .-These demands, as heretofore stated, areas follows: First, the release of the officers and crew of the Virginius living : Second, the return of the Virginius; Third, the usual salute to the flag; and, Fourth, provision for the only reservation on the part of Spain is with reference to the firing of the salute. To enable the future investigations to be made, the date for this salute has been fixed at 25th of Dec.
