AMNESTY FOR ALL OF THE CARLISTS.

THE POPE BLESSES ALFONSO. SERRANO AT BAYONNE.

Pants, Jan. 4-Noon-At the request of Princess Bearn, of Vienna, King Alfonso has granted complete amnesty to all the Carlists.

The King of the Belgians has recognized King Alfonso and telegraphed his congratulations. The recegnition of the King, by most of the European Courts, is momentarily expected. The papal nuncio, in this city, has received the blessing of the Pope asked for by the King. His Majesty will issue from this city a decree con-

voking the Cortes. The staff of the Spanish Embas y, in Paris, have waited on King Alfonso and paid him their homage. The King, in reply to their address, said he would not disguise the difficulties of his task, and he sought aid of able men, of all parties. His first wish was for the pacification of Spain, and he desired to be the Kingofall Spaniards.
