He commented upon the message of the President in reply to the revolution of the 8th inst. and said a paper more full of omissions of material facts never emanated from the Chief Magistrate of this country. He argued that the dispatched of Sheridan were one-sided and did not tell the whole truth. He replied to the charges of Southern outrages, and said a great majority of the homicides in the South were committed by blacks upon blacks and were not by whites upon blacks, as had been charged. In conclusion, he said it was a bad thing to assessinate a man, but a worse thing to assessinate the Constitution of a State; these acts of the military in Louisians have driven a dagger to the heart of free institutions in this
