THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT QUESTION AGITATED.

Paris, Jan. 29 - Noon-The motion for the withdrawal of all constitutional bills defeats the motion pending that the government shall consist of a Senate Chamber and a President of the republic. Louis Blanc opposed the creation of the Presidency, had been fatal to the republic in 1848. The vote will be taken to-day.
