COMMITTEE REPORTS ON AR-KANSAS.

WASHINGTON, Feb 6-Noon-SENATE -Sherman presented a memorial from the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce in favor of granting aid asked by the Texas Pacific Railroad.

Washington, Feb. 5.—Night—SanATE: The credentials of Theo. F. Kan-

dolph, from New Jersey, were read and placed on file. Pratt, of Indiana, from the Commet-

tee on Pensions, reported back the bill granting pensions to certain sol-diers and sailors of the war of 1812, and widows of deceased soldiers, and to restore to the pension rolls the names of persons stricken threfrom in consequence of disloyalty, with an amendment in the nature of a substitute. Placed on Calendar.

In reporting the bill Pratt said that the substitute admitted to the pension rolls the names of all surviving officers, soldiers and sailors of the war of 1812 who had served in that war for a period of 30 days, and also were honorably discharged, and did not voluntaring engage in the late rebellion.

It also admitted all surviving officers

and soldiers who served in the Indian war of 1811, and surviving members of Seneca Indian Nation who served in the war of 1812, and finally restored to the roll the names of all persons now surviving, stricken therefrom by the act of 1862, to be paid from the pas-
