The Senate cancussed this morning on the order of business. There was a slim attendance. The Civil Rights bill was considered, but no conclusion

was reached upon and subject The Library Committee heard Gen. Denver and others of the Mexican Veteran Association in favor of an equestrian statue in honor of Gen.

Zachray Taylor ... Alcorn introduced a bill for the relief of the overflowed Mississippi

river lands. The Indian bill was taken up, but

gave way to enlogies. The debate in the House to-day was on the motion made by Burhard, of Illinois, to strike out of the Tariff bid the 5th section, which provides for the restoration of the 10 per cent. reduction on manufactured goods. Nearly all the members from Pennsylvania, Democratic as well as Repu lican, spoke in favor of retaining the section. The single exception was in the case of Storm, a Pennsylvania Democrat, who, to the amazement and chagrin of all his colleagues, supported the motion to strike out the section, and avowed himself unqualifiedly a free trader. The motion to strike out was lost by a vote of 86 to 98, and then, without finishing the bill, it was laid aside, and eulogies were pronounced on the four recently deceased men bers of the House, Crocker and Hooper, of Massachusetts, Hussey, of

Maryland, and Rice, of Himois. The Louisiana Committee will report through Mr. Forster on Tuesday and a minority report will be submitted by Mr. G. E. Hoar. The report of the Committee, which will be signed by Messrs. Ferster, Phelps, Potter and Marshall, will adhere to the origi nal views presented in the sub committee report, and contains a recommendation that a resolution urging the proper authorities in Louisiana to give the control of the lower House to the Conservative members be adopted by the House. Some of those signing the report will express their willingness to support a resolution form lly recognizing h. Kellogg Gov. ernmens, but the resolution their re-port does not urge, for the reason that the rights of Kellogg bave not been established by any evidence taken by the committee, but are admitted upon general rumor, and as the best possible solution of the present difficulties.
