WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 26 - Novi -SENATE - The tariff bill was reported from the Committee on Finance without amendment. The committee being

House-A compromise was made as to business instead of occupying the day in the reading of yesterday's Jour nal. The day was given to the Ap propriation bill. The evening session was assigned to debate on the Force bill, and the previous question is to be called on it to-morrow. The House went into Committee on the sondry Civil Appropriation bill.
Washington, Feb. 26.—Night—The

Mississippi Investigation Committee have reported. The Republicans sign one report and the Democrats the other, the majority report closing with the recommendation of the passage of the caucus force bill, and that the violent action in Vicksburg justifies Gov. Ames in calling on President Grant

James N. Tyner was to-day nominated and confirmed Second Assistant Postmaster-General.

It is conceded that the Democrats gained a substantial and great victory by allowing the debate on the civil rights bill to close on Saturday afternoon, after which limited debate is to continue indefinitely on amendments. The Republicans determined to force the vote on Thursday night; had this been done it would have left two additional days for Pinchback, Lonist-ana and the caucus force bill. The Democrats are now confident of defeating all other political legislation. The proceedings in the House on the sundry civil appropriation bill were

dry and uninteresting. The items for purchasing Miss Carpenter's picture of the signing of the emancipation proclamation, at \$10,000 and \$25,000 respectively, were stricken out on a point of order, and the one for Miss Vinnie Reams' statue of Admiral Farragutinsertel, the lat-ter being under contract. When the Committee rose the bill was not quite half finished, the pending question being an apppropriation to pay the expenses of the suit to recover possession of the New Idria quick-silver mines, the famous McGarrahan claim,

The session to-night was for debate only on the force bill. The fact that the Democrats waived their right to have the long journal of yesterday read, which would have consumed six or seven hours, is probably an indication that they have not much appre-hension that the force bill can be
