LOUISIANA.

DECISION OF THE AWARDED COMMITTEE.

New York, March 16.—Noon.—As most of the papers submitted to the Louisiana Committee had been thoroughly examined on Friday and Saturday and the claims of the contestants nearly all decided, the business of the members yesterday morning consisted chiefly in preparing their report.

At the close of the session Mr. Wheeler informed the representatives of the press that the Committee had closed their investigation and made the awards. In the case of nineteen representatives whose claims were submitted to their arbitration, from all evidences which had come into its possession, as well as during the previous investigation, as from an examination of the election record, he said the members of the Committee had unanimously agreed in their awards, but for reasons which the public would appreciate it had been decided not to make the result of their deliberations known at present.
