WILMINGTON TOWNSHIP

The Board of Trustees and Tax-Listers for the Township and City of Wilmington will proceed, on the first day of April, 1875, and for twenty days thereafter, at the City Hall, in the City of Wilmington, between the hours of 9 A. M., and 2 P. M., and every Friday evening during the mouth of April between the hours of 6 P. M. and 9 P. M., on said days, to List the taxable Lands and Property, and make the assessments required by law.

Ail persons and corporations within this Township and City are required by law to give in their taxables, and attend at the above time and place for the purpose specified, within twenty days, under the penalty of double tax,

Extract from Act to Raise Bevenue: "All persons who are liable for a Poli Tax. and shall willfully fail to give themselves in and all persons who own Property and fall to List within the time allowed, shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be fined, not more than Fifty Dollars, or imprisoned not more than Thirty Days."




