they are persons, and therefore under the 14th Amendment, declared to be citizens of the State wherein they reside; but it did not require that amendment to make them such; they were, before, persons and people, and were not in terms excluded from calis uship by the Constitution. The Federal Constitution was ordained by the people of the United States, composed of the people of the several states, and whoever at the time of its adoption was one of the people, became a citizen. All children born of
