TERRIFIC EXPLOSION OF GIANT POWDER.

MANY LIVES AND HALF A MIL LION LOST.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 8-Noon-A quantity of giant powder contained in a frame building exploded to-day, crushing the walls of Hathaway's bonded warehouse corner of Spear and Harrison streets.
