He talked with all class es and conditions of men regarding the public. conditions of men regarding the political feelings of the people of the South, and was surprised to find the prevalence of amity and good will to be universal. Judge Kelley has lost all faith in the stories of Ku-Klux and

Southern outrages, having personally proven them to be the myths of mere partisan malevolence. When a Republican of such emineuce as Judge Kelley gives testimony such as this, it would seem as if it were time indeed for Mr. Williams to retire to his native wilds of Oregon, and for the superservicable organs of the ca pet-baggers to learn new tunes to stir up vindictive feelings against the South. It would also appear to be time to withdraw our army from those places where it is not wanted, and to send it to the Texas frontier where it is wanted very much. As a new crop of Southern outrages will be required next Fall, it will be just as

well for the North to remember the testimony of Judge Kelley.
