THE FIRE FIEND.

St. John's, N. B., May 29.—Noon.—A quarter million dollars fire occurred in this city.

Wilmington, W. Va., May 29.—Noon.—The Riverside Mill Factory has been burnt. Loss \$75,000.

Holyoke, Mass., May 29.—Noon.—At the fire at the French Catholic Church, there were seventy-one dead, twenty-two fatally burned and twenty-seven injured.

Worcester, Mass., May 29.—Noon.—The Granite Block on Main street, nearly opposite the City Hall, has been burnt. Cause, mansard roofs.

A frame stable, two men, eight horses and a number of wagons, were burned in New York yesterday.

Berlin, May 29.—Noon.—The King and Queen of Sweden are here, visiting. It is thought that their visit induces Sweden's support of the policy of the three Emperors.

A judicial investigation shows that the offer of Wiesinger to assassinate Bismarck was merely on the part of an attempt to extort money and the man had no accomplices.

Munich, May 29.—Noon.—Johann Klein, an eminent painter, is dead.

FROM THE CHESAPEAKE TO THE GULF.

Washington, May 29.—Night.—Col. Forenc, General Manager of the Virginia Midland Railroad, reports that the steam lifter at Lynchburg, Va., is completed and in perfect operation.

The palace car, leaving New Orleans to-day, will come through to Baltimore without a change via Atlanta, Knoxville, Bristol, Lynchburg, and the Virginia Midland Railroad.

The palace car, leaving Baltimore Monday morning, will go to New Orleans by the same route, it being the commencement of a permanent line of through cars between the Chesapeake Bay to the Gulf of Mexico.

The President has appointed Chas. P. Lincoln, of Mississippi, Consul to Canton, China.

Quarantine Notice. UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE ALL VESSELS from Ports South of Cape Fear will come to the Visiting Station, near Deep Water Point, and await the inspection of the Quarantine Physician.

All vessels from Ports where Yellow Fever, or other infectious disease exists, will be required to undergo a rigid and prolonged Quarantine.

All vessels or boats of any character having sickness on board on arrival, or having had sickness any time during the voyage, are required to come to the Station for inspection without regard to the Port from whence they come. Vessels not included as above will proceed without detention.

Pilots are especially enjoined to make careful enquiry relative to vessels, crew, &c., and if not satisfied with the statements of the Captain or commander, or if the vessel is in a filthy condition, they will bring the vessel to the Station for further examination.

Pilots willfully violating the Quarantine Laws are subject to a forfeiture of their branch. Masters of vessels to a fine of two hundred dollars a day for every day they violate the Quarantine Laws, and all other persons are liable for each and every offence.

All vessels subject to visitation under above regulations, will set a flag in the main-gig, port-side.
