This morning the children, on a writ of habeas corpus sued out in this city by a law firm of this city, acting as counmay 23

sel for the gandfather of the children. who wished to detain them, were brought before Chief Judge Brown and, after a hearing, were remanded to the eastedy of the father, Mr. Schreiner.
