

SOUTH AMERICA.

LATER ADVICES IN REGARD TO THE EARTHQUAKE HORRORS.

NEW YORK, July 6-Noon.-The latest mail advices from different freshing and agreeable. places in Columbia more than confirm the horrors by the earthquake in May. A letter from Salaza dated May 28th, says: Cucuta is in a pitiful sight.-Everything is in ruins; not a house has been left standing. Thieves and robbers from the surrounding country have swept down on the ill-fated city and hardly a single safe has been saved from the Custom House. Four hundred mules were killed in the strests and as there is no one to remove them the stench is becoming frightful. The villages of San Cristobal, Farina, Griasimo, Capacha, SanAntonio, Lobetera, San Juan de Urena, Rosario and San Cayetano are completely destroyed. The store-house at Puerto de Los C chos was sacked and burned by bandits.

A letter from Ocana, May 30, says Ten thousand people were killed at Cneuta in addition to other thousands who were seriously wounded and bruised. Death and destruction reigned everywhere. Great numbers of the haciendas have been destroyed and hundreds of houses in the contry overturned, leaving the people con-signed to poverty. Many of the trees were torn up from the roots and small nills were opened like a melon. The cause of the great catastrophe is nuknown and the precise place of the irst manifestation. Some suppose that ed everywhere. Great numbers of the first manifestation. Some suppose that the volcano at Sabatera, which was in action in 1848, is again breaking out, while others say that a new volcano has appeared in the hills of Giracha.

A private letter from Bucaramanga. of May 24 says in Piedecnesta the town hall is destroyed, and in Paneplona the Cathedral is in ruins.

A telegrain from Hon. Aquilo Parra to President Perez, dated Bucaramto President Perez, dated Buoaram-auga, May 24, says the earthquakes continue. Last night the Cathedral in Paneplona feil, causing great alarm. There is great devastation throughout the valley of Cucuta.

A dispatch to President Perez, from Chinacota, May 24, says the popula-tion of San Jose, Rosario, and Oaye-tano have disappeared. The rest of the depot is in ruins. There are more than 4,000 victims.

A despatch from Cocororo, dated May 24, says the situation is assuming a grave aspect, and sickness and star-vation in Paneplona are increasing.

A telegra.n from Chiquinquira, of May 22, says the shocks are repeating. There were two last night and one to-day, and there is great alarm among the people. Appeals for help were be-ing circulated through all the cities of Columbia, and the most liberal responses were being made.


