A POISONING CASE.—A lady of Lexington gives us through the mail some explanation of a case which excited much interest in Lexington, and has also been the subject of some exaggeration. It appears that a white servant girl employed in the family of Dr. Pinxus infused poison into soup intended for two invalid children. Mrs. Pinxus tasted the soup before giving it to the children, detected the facts of its being poisoned, and saved the children, but was herself made violently ill and life endangered. She has, however, recovered. The girl confessed the crime, but disavowed the intention of poisoning any but Charlie Pinxus, a cadet at Bingham's School, a home during vacation, and also the two children. The girl was not arrested as has gone to parts unknown.—*Raleigh News.*
