SOUTH CAROLINA.

FIRE IN CHARLESTON.

CHARLESTON, S. C., July 24.—A fire occurred here this morning in the section of the city known as Godsdens Wharf, destroying about fifty small wooden buildings; also Robbs mill, and Marshalls, and Vennings warehouse, with abouty 20,000 barrels of naval stores. The loss is estimated at a quarter of amillion of dollars, of which about one half is believed to be covered by insurance, distributed amongst Charleston, Northern and foreign com-

The fire is still burning, and is impossible, as yet, to ascertain more definite particulars.

COLLECTOR ARRESTED FOR SEIZURE OF DISTIL-

MILWAUREE, July 24.-J. M. Benn, collector of internal revenue, and a deputy collector, were arrested yesterday on an order issued by the commissioner of a State Court, on complaint of one Ferdman to Hartman. The collector had seized a distillery and contents to enforce payment of an assess-ment. Among the contents were four-teen barrels of highwines, of which Hartman claimed to be the owner, The defendants were held to bail in the sum of seventeen thousand dollars

IOWA.

SIX MEN KILLED AT THE PAPER MILL EXPLOSION.

Iowa City, July 24.—Six men were killed by the explosion of Classe's paper mill. The sixth was a Scotchman named Walter Tenton, who was in the capstraw chamber and over the exploded tank. He was seen to go up with the tank, and over it to an estimated height of five hundred feet, and when falling, went through the roof of a paint shop seventy-five yards away from the mill, knocking a hole through the shingles and inch sheating beneeth, and breaking two rafters. BARK R. J. CAMPBELL FOUN-DERED AT SEA. THIRTEEN PASSENGERS LOST.

New York, July 24.—Last evening a man called at the Station House in Brooklyn and reported that he had found the following letter on Coney Island Beach:

HON, SECRETARY OF THE NAVY, WASHINGTON D. C .- There are twentynine cases of fever at Baraneas. Our quarantines are strict, but supplies have to be furnished. Should the disease break out in our vicinity, I suggest that the yards be closed and placed in charge of acclimated employers, and the officers and families all go to save themselves. No sickness in quarantine or at Pensacola. Women and children are strickened down at Barraucas, [Signed]
