CUBA.

A PASSENGER FORCIBLY TAKEN BY THE SPANISH AUTHORI-TIES FROM A BRITISH

STEAMER-THE LA-TEST WAR MOVE-MENTS.

NEW YORK, July 30.—A letter from St Thomas says: "The Spanish au-thorities at St. John, Porto Rico took off a passenger named Louis Venegas, from the British steamship Eider, by force, despite the protest of the Captain, and it was reported that Veregue had been shot. It said, that he had beld a position in the Spanish army-and absconded with public funds. He was en route from St. Thomas for San Domingo, on the Eider which put into Porto Bico. When the Captain of the Eider refused to give up Varegas, a Spanish gueboat took a position in front of her ready for action Captain Sher said he was not prepared to resist the force and had to surrender his passenger under protest. It was also said that Veregas was only a political offender.

A Havre letter dated the 24th, savs a Nuevitas letter of June the 25th says : "About ten days ago a large Spanish convoy left Puerto Principe for Guatmara consisting of forty five ox carts and ninety-three pack-mules, loaded with arms and ammunition and pro-visions and a hundred and fifty thousand dollars in gold, for the army at Coscona and Gwatmara. The convoy was guarded by five hundred soldiers under command of Col. Huelches. It was suddenly attacked by the rebels, who was eight hundred strong and under command of Gen'ls. Gaucia and Reeves, and whose force of guards and escort was thrown into confusion and the convoy was captured by the rebels, Loss of Spanish troops was about one hundred and fifty killed, among the number, Col. Huelches, who was in command. Rebel's loss could not be ascertained.
