EDMONDSON COUNTY.
A short visit to this county on Wednesday was extremely pleasant by our many friends at Lumberton. We found there a very large crowd assembled to hear the respective candidates of the two parties, and the Hon. Thomas H. Ashe, member of Congress for the District, and Mr. J. A. Engelhard, who were present by invitation.

Mr. G. A. McEachin, one of the Democratic candidates opened the discussion, in a very fine speech, which was well received. Dr. E. M. Norment, the candidate of the negro party replied in a rambling, evasive and demagogical language, which was intended and succeeded in gaining the applause of his side hearers.

Dr. D. Sinclair, in one of the best speeches we ever listened to, thoroughly exposed the redoubtable Radical, and gave the most conclusive reason for the call of a Convention. He was listened to for an hour with the most earnest attention and the warmest applause.

Hon. John B. Ashe, then took the stand, and in a speech of great force, delivered with an earnestness and impressiveness of manner, urged upon his hearers the absolute necessity of constitutional reform. His position upon the finding of North Carolina could see and hear

force of the restriction as adopted by the Legislature, was answerable. This whole speech was masterly and convincing, and evidently had the greatest effect upon the crowd.

Dr. Norment, by agreement, was allowed a reply to Mr. Ashe; and for an hour funeral went much to the satisfaction of the negroes, and to the disgust of all decent white people. Immediately upon the close of his speech he left, taking with him most of the negroes.

Major Engelhard then addressed the crowd for about an hour, closing by an appeal to the white men of Robeson to do their full duty.

We found that the people of that county are thoroughly aroused and we have great hopes that yesterday they reversed the decision of last year. Col. W. Foster French, was and had been for some days actively engaged in the canvass. At St. Pauls, Howellsville, Lumberbridge and other points, his voice had been heard in behalf of the white men, and his efforts will have an important bearing upon the result. We sincerely trust that Robeson has again allied herself with the white man's party.

Quarantine Notice.

UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE ALL VESSELS FROM PORTS SOUTH OF CAPE FEAR WILL COME TO THE QUARANTINE STATION, NEAR DEEP WATER POINT, AND AWAIT THE INSPECTION OF THE QUARANTINE PHYSICIAN.

ALL VESSELS OR BOATS WHERE YELLOW FEVER, OR OTHER INFECTIVE DISEASE EXISTS, WILL BE REQUIRED TO UNDERGO A RIGID AND PROLONGED QUARANTINE.

ALL VESSELS OR BOATS OF ANY CHARACTER HAVING SICKNESS ON BOARD ON ARRIVAL, OR HAVING HAD SICKNESS ANY TIME DURING THE VOYAGE, ARE REQUIRED TO COME TO THE STATION, FOR INSPECTION WITHOUT REGARD TO THE PORT FROM WHICH THEY CAME. VESSELS NOT INCLUDED ABOVE WILL PRECEDE WITHOUT DETENTION.

PLATES ARE ESPECIALLY ENJOINED TO MAKE CAREFUL AND PERIODICAL ENQUIRIES AS TO THE STATE OF HEALTH AND CONDUCT OF THOSE ON BOARD, AND IF NOT SATISFIED WITH THE STATEMENTS OF THE CAPTAIN OR COMMANDER, OR IF THE VESSEL IS IN A FITTY CONDITION, THEY WILL BRING THE VESSEL TO THE STATION FOR FURTHER EXAMINATION.

PLATES ARE SUBJECT TO A FORFEITURE OF THEIR BENCHES, MASTERS OF VESSELS TO A FINE OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS A DAY FOR EVERY DAY THEY VIOLATE THE QUARANTINE LAW; AND ALL OTHER PERSONS ARE LIABLE FOR EACH AND EVERY OFFENSE.

ALL VESSELS SUBJECT TO INSPECTION, UNDER ABOVE REGULATIONS, WILL SET A FLAG IN THE MAIN RIGGING, PORT SIDE.


