ELECTRICISMS.

A St. Louis dispatch says John A. Joyce, late revenue agent, has absconded with \$150,000.

The Cincinnati Gazette has letters from one hundred and forty counties where the recent flood occurred. The prospects are much better than was expected.

THE MINING REGIONS.
Cheyenne, August 11.—Gen. Cook and Col. Stanton have returned from the Black Hills. The miners are preparing to leave the country. The mountains are full of Quartz. Capital and skilled labor will develop mines equal to those of Colorado and Nevada. There were 1,500 miners in the hills who had done much preliminary work.

RAILROAD ACCIDENT.

DENVER, August 11.—An accident occurred on the Denver and South Park Railroad. James Smith, telegraph repairer, was killed; also, Mrs. Jane Lane and daughter were fatally injured. Numbers severely hurt.

EUROPE.

THE TROUBLES BETWEEN TURKEY AND PRUSSIA.

LONDON, August 11.—A telegram to the Times from Constantinople says 2,000 Turkish troops left for Horta Gonia via Katak. The Post publishes sections of the Turkish and Prussian frontier guards. The affair pertained the Hussians, who trespassed on German territory.

SAN FRANCISCO, August 11.—The Russian City Panama reports that the Revolutionists attempted to sack San Blas. They were defeated, and fled.

CONSTANTINOPLE, August 11.—The Governor of Bosnia has issued orders to send all available troops in that province to protect it from insurgents. Two battalions have been sent from this city. Others will follow.

DEATH OF EX-GOVERNOR WILLIAM A. GRAHAM.

SARATOGA, August 11.—Ex-Governor William A. Graham, of North Carolina, died of organic disease of the heart at Congress Hall this morning; he came here about three weeks since and had been confined to his room for four days.

Quarantine Notice.

UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE ALL VESSELS from Ports South of Cape Fear will come to the Visiting Station, near Deep Water Point, and await the inspection of the Quarantine Physician.

All vessels from Ports where Yellow Fever, or other infectious disease exists, will be required to undergo a rigid and prolonged Quarantine.

All vessels or boats of any character having sickness on board on arrival, or having had sickness any time during the voyage, are required to come to the Station for inspection without regard to the Port from whence they come. Vessels not included as above will proceed without detention.

Pilots are especially enjoined to make careful enquiry relative to vessels, crew, &c., and if not satisfied with the statements of the Captain or commander, or if the vessel is in a filthy condition, they will bring the vessel to the Station for further examination.

Pilots willfully violating the Quarantine Laws are subject to a forfeiture of their branch Masters of vessels to a fine of two hundred dollars a day for every day they violate the Quarantine Laws; and all other persons are liable for each and every offence.

All vessels subject to visitation under above regulations, will set a flag in the main rigging, port side.
