GOVERNOR GRAHAM.
Honors to the distinguished Gen.
(Special to Journal.)
RALEIGH, August 12, 1875.

There was a meeting of both the bar and citizens here to-day. Resolutions were passed and arrangements were made for the reception of the remains of Ex-Governor Graham at Weldon to-morrow morning. The remains will lie in state at the Capitol from 2 to 7 o'clock, when they will be taken to Hillsboro for interment. Business will be suspended while the remains are in the city.

TERRIBLE ACCIDENT.
Probable Fatal Accident to a Delegate to the Convention.
(Special to Journal.)
TARBORO, August 12, 1875.

The Southerner of to-day says: "About 12 o'clock Wednesday night, while the negroes were engaged in firing cannons, in celebration of Thursday's result, McCabe, an enthusiastic white Radical, in ramming the gun was seriously injured by premature discharge. The attending physician is of the opinion that both eyes are injured for life while his face, breast and hands are horribly burned. It is probable that the accident will prove fatal. McCabe is a member elect to the Convention, but his injuries will doubtless necessitate the election of another person. We learn that he was one of the two white men on the ground."

GOTHAM.
MORE ABOUT DUNCAN, SHERMAN & CO'S FAILURES.
NEW YORK, August 12.—The Tribune says a discovery has been made that a large amount of the indebtedness of Duncan, Sherman & Co. held in this city, is "accommodation paper," in the form of drafts, drawn on them by a confidential clerk in their office, and accepted by them and sold to various banks through note bankers. An announcement is also made that letters of credit, for which the responsible, amount only to about thirty thousand dollars.

UTAH.
THE INDIANS AT CARINNE.
SALT LAKE CITY, August 12.—Women and children are being sent from Carinne from apprehensions of an Indian attack. A company of troops have left for Carinne. The News, a church paper, says the stories of hostile bearing Indians circulated to create a feeling against the Mormons, is untrue and the Indians are at Carinne for peaceful purposes. Lieutenant Bryant, who has been at Carinne all day, thinks matters threatening and has ordered two additional companies there. The Indians are Mormons and claim certain grounds granted them by the Mormons.

EUROPE.
THE WAR TROUBLES.
LONDON, Aug. 13.—A special to the Standard says a great number of Montenegres has joined the insurgents. It is asserted on good authority that Russia will not prevent the Montenegres from siding with the Herzegovians. Constantinople, Aug. 13.—Turkish newspapers of this city say the situation in Herzegovina is becoming grave. Bands of insurgents have encamped into the plains and attacked Tebnigne, burning and pillaging in all directions.

Quarantine Notice.
UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE ALL VESSELS from Porto Rico or Cape Fear will come to at the Visiting Station, near Deep Water Point, and await the inspection of the Quarantine Physician.
All vessels from Porto where Yellow Fever, or other infectious disease exists, will be required to undergo a rigid and prolonged Quarantine.
All vessels or boats of any character having sickness on board on arrival, or having had sickness any time during the voyage, are required to come to the Station for inspection without regard to the Port from whence they come. Vessels not included as above will proceed without detention.
Pilots are especially enjoined to make careful enquiry relative to ves els, crew, &c., and if not satisfied with the statements of the Captain or commander, or if the vessel is in a filthy condition, they will bring the vessel to the Station for further examination.
Pilots willfully violating the Quarantine Laws are subject to a forfeiture of their branch; Masters of vessels to a fine of two hundred dollars a day for every day they violate the Quarantine Laws; and all other persons are liable for each and every offence.
All vessels subject to visitation under above regulations, will set a flag in the main, tugging, port-side.
