Its liabilities are \$14,000,000, and its assets are \$7,000,000, and liable to "abrinkage" at that, in spite of its being a specie company and a specie bank!

Nor is this all. The National Gold Bank and Trust Company has closed its doors, and so has the Merchants' Exchange Bank-both of them specie banks!

What does all this teach us? That specie, or hard money currency, is injurious to a country, and unable to afford facilities for the transaction of business? Not at all. It does teach, however, that specie, or hard money, alone, will not make a country prosperous, nor prevent fraud, nor stop overtrading. Nor is soft money any more responsible for the troubles upon the Atlantic coast, than is specie responsible for the trouble upon the Pacific.


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
