WASHINGTON.

Still Pottinger Over Mississippi.

Washington, Sept. 14.—No action has been taken in the Mississippi question, nor will there be until all the papers and official correspondence are got together.

The Secretary of War has returned from his Western inspection tour.

A colored woman has sued the Pullman Car Company for \$500, for refusing her sleeping car accommodations from Cincinnati hither.

The Government is still waiting for further official dispatches from Mississippi.

Late this afternoon the Attorney-General received a dispatch from ex-Senator Poese, and one from Lieut. Guilaro, commanding the U. S. troops in the vicinity of the recent reported disturbed districts. Both report everything perfectly quiet. There is no disturbance, and they regard the sending of troops there, entirely unnecessary.

State Election.

Portland, Sept. 14.—The returns from forty towns give Union 25,670, and Roberts 26,160. The Republican majority will probably reach 5,000, against 10,000 last year. There will be a Democratic majority in the Senate. The House will probably be unchanged.

The Constitutional party in France are striving to compel M. Buffet to break with the Bonapartists.

The Bank of California will resume business on the first of next month.

Montenegro has informed the insurgents that she cannot make war on the Porte.

Two hundred men and women in Russia have been indicted for Socialism.

Wm. Harris, colored, while attempting to escape arrest in Louisville, was shot and killed by policeman Hendricks.

Robt. A. Rife, formerly cashier Fourth National Bank at Cincinnati, has been arrested for forgery.

The Diocesan Convention of the Episcopal Church has convened at Chicago.

During the trial of a new fire escape ladder in New York, one of the sections parted, killing three men outright, and wounding several.

The Association of Mexican Veterans celebrated the anniversary of the capture of the City of Mexico, yesterday. One hundred members present.

Edward Conway, convicted of entering a house in New York, pretending to be a Sanitary Inspector, and assaulting a lady, and stealing \$50, was sentenced to twenty years imprisonment.
