The Democratic party renew their pledge of fidelity to the principles adopted and affirmed unanimously by the delegates representing the Democrata of all the United States together assembled in their latest National Convention, and since recognized and

Convention, and since re-approved and endorsed by a Democratic majority in fifteen States, comprising more than half the total population of the Union. Adopted from the National Convention held at Baltimore, July 10, 1872: Seventh—The public credit must be sacredly maintained, and we denounce rapudiation in every shape and form.

Eighth—A speedy return to specie payment is demanded alike by the highest consideration of commercial morality and honest government.

To these authentic declarations of Democratic principle and policy the times give proof.

The present depression of business is caused by the reaction from the unhealthy stimulus of an excessive and depreciated and irredeemable currency, depreciated and irredeemable currency, and by enormous and ill-adjusted municipal and Federal taxation, and by the extravagance, waste and speculation in the administration of public affairs. The remedy for this evil is not to be found in the renewal of any of the causes, in the face of the fact that the existing volume of the currency is greater than can be absorbed by business, and that the recent fail of prices was followed by repeated inflation. Any attempt to increase the currency would be worse than ineffectual to revise prosperity, for it would interrupt the healing processes of industry. It would be worse than futile to restore confidence, for it would create distrust and new uncertainties in business, paralizing the beginnings of enterprise and robbing labor of its scanty employment, and while stifling the progress of legislative reforms, would inflict lasting dishonor upon the credit, intelligence and character of the country. of the causes, in the face of the fact
