### WASHINGTON.

**Mall Changes.**  
WASHINGTON, Sept. 24.—The following changes have been made in the time of departure from New York of steamers carrying foreign mails: The *Etna* instead of the *Atlas* on the 25th inst., for Kingston and New Grenada. The *Atlas* will leave on the 29th for Hayti only.

### MISSISSIPPI.

**Injunction.**  
JACKSON, Sept. 24.—Chief Justice Peyton, republican, has granted an injunction restraining the Auditor from paying money to the support of Ames' militia. He held that the mustering of militia in times of profound peace was creating a standing army of State troops, in violation of the Constitution.

### COLORADO.

**Death of a Judge.**  
DENVER, Sept. 24.—Judge A. N. Harrison, a prominent politician and a native of Virginia, is dead.

### OHIO.

**Agricultural Congress.**  
CINCINNATI, Sept. 24.—The National Agricultural Congress is in session. Resolutions were recommended asking for a uniform tax of ten cents per pound on tobacco, and free import on material used in its manufacture. Speeches made by members show an equal division on the currency question. W. C. Flagg, of Illinois, was elected president at the ensuing year.

### NEW YORK.

**Spain and Cuba—Insurance Convention Inquest and Verdict, &c.**  
NEW YORK, Sept. 24.—The text of the propositions of peace made by the Spanish Government to the Cuban insurgents, were received at the Cuban agency to-day, and peremptorily refused.

Thirty creditors of Henry Claws & Co. oppose the release of that firm from bankruptcy. The creditors will have another conference next week.

The Insurance Convention has gone into executive session. The proceedings heretofore consisted of speeches. The coroner's jury in the aerial ladder accident, returned a verdict declaring that the ladder was made of inferior wood, and the construction faulty. They censured the Board of Fire Commissioners for omitting the usual scientific and practical tests. Further use of the ladder was condemned.

Juan Gonzalez, a Cuban, was to-day sentenced to imprisonment for life for life.

### KENTUCKY.

**Convicted—Heavy Tax.**  
DANVILLE, Sept. 24.—H. B. Nichols, charged with the murder of W. Pennington, in July last, was to-day found guilty and sentenced to be hanged. Motion will be made for a new trial.

### TEXAS.

**Assistance Refused.**  
GALVESTON, Sept. 24.—Mrs. Herndon and family, reported drowned at Velasco, are safe. The Adjutant-General telegraphed to the Secretary of War for aid in the Alabama case. The Secretary replied that Texas does not come within the scope of aid provided for by law.

### ENGLAND.

**Servia—Carlists Surrounded.**  
LONDON, Sept. 24.—A Vienna dispatch reports that two members of the Servian Ministry voted against the address to Prince Milan and were in favor of war. A special states that twenty-five hundred Carlists are hemmed in by ten thousand Alfoonsists at Viella, and will probably be forced over the border at Pont du Roi.

### SPAIN.

**The Pope and Alfonso.**  
MADRID, Sept. 24.—The ministerial papers announce that the Government will make no concessions prejudicial to independence. The magistrates are dealing with the bishops, especially the Bishop of Seo de Urgel.

### TURKEY.

**Priest Zarkoo's Force.**  
BEGRADE, Sept. 24.—It is stated the priest Zarkoo has a force of seven thousand men, with which he will attempt the capture of the cities of Sjenitz and Prissen.

### ELECTRICISMS.

The body of Dr. Peel, drowned at Galveston, on Wednesday, has been recovered.

The Herndon House, Marshall, Mich., was burned last night. Four guests were burned to death.

Smith, Craig & Co's lumber yard, Troy, N. Y., burned. Loss \$30,000.

Madan Jean Louise Paron, famous musician and composer, is dead.

The Pope has appointed Monsignor Diaz bishop of Cuba.

Edgar Snowden, proprietor of the Alexandria (Va.) Gazette, is dead.
