NOON DISPATCHES.

ARKANSAS.

A Negro Mob Repulsed.

HELENA, Oct. 6.—Many white ladies including Senator Alcorn's daughter, are here from Friars Point for safety. The negroes three hundred strong, came within a short distance of Friars Point, Gen. Chalmers, who commands the whites, moved out and gave them ten minutes to disperse in. The negroes reorganized three miles out, when they were again dispersed on the approach of the whites. The negroes are supposed to be waiting for reinforcements. Col. Burke and others have gone down from here to organize forces to go down to night.

HELENA, Oct. 6.—The Sheriff of Coahoma County caused our town to be invaded this morning by an armed mob of negroes. We drove them back. We are fully organized for defense, with Senator Alcorn and Gen. Chalmers in command. The sheriff has fled the county. Send us aid immediately. Send H. P. Reid.

National Grange—Destructive Fires. LOUISVILLE, Oct. 6.—The executive committee of the national grange, is in session in this city. The directors of the Mississippi Valley Trading Company are in conference with the commissioners concerning the direct trade in grange products, with England.

Five large barns in Robertson county, Tennessee, were burned during the past week, involving a loss of forty thousand pounds of tobacco. The Courier-Journal's special says, the fires were occasioned by gases arising from the tobacco by a peculiar atmospheric phenomena.

WASHINGTON.

A Review of Sherman's Memories. WASHINGTON, Oct. 6.—The announcement of a lengthy review of Sherman's memoirs made up chiefly from official sources of the war department, reached here to day. It will make a volume as large as one of Sherman's. Free access to the official files for the purpose of finding this compilation was given at the department, to the author. It is by Gen. Boyton, and will be published in a fortnight by Wiltsack & Baldwin, of Cincinnati.

TENNESSEE.

The Negro War—A \$20,000 Fraud.

MEMPHIS, Oct. 6.—The impression prevails here that no blood was shed at Friars Point, and that no steps had been taken to forward men and arms from here. A body of organized men, will go from Helena. Alcorn had 70 cavalry and 40 infantry with which he had driven off two hundred negroes under Brown. The steamer Maid from Helena reports no fighting. The situation is unchanged.

CHARTERHOUSE, Oct. 6.—Henry C. Avery, formerly of this vicinity, but of Texas since the war, was arrested for passing fraudulent government claims of over \$20,000.

MASSACHUSETTS.

Convention—Failure—Nomination.

LOWELL, Oct. 6.—A tramp was arrested on suspicion of having committed the outrage on Miss Longmire. His face was scratched and his clothing was bloody. He admits of having left Sudbury about the time of the murder.

The State Labor Reform Convention has 30 delegates. E. M. Chamberlain of Boston, presiding. The resolution that it was inexpedient to make the nominations of state officers, was laid.

Howes & Blanchard founders, have failed.

A prohibition party met at Tremont Temple. The hall was well filled with ladies. Rev. D. E. Eddy president. The committee on resolutions reported among other resolutions "Resolve 1 that the safety of the republic and the cause of prohibition depends upon making the party a unit for the right, which can best be done by defeating Alexander H. Rice. A committee of thirteen was appointed to nominate a prohibition candidate for Governor. Jas. L. Baker was nominated.
