WASHINGTON.

Indian Investigating Committee. &c. Washington, Oct. 18. - The Indian Investigation Committee have made their report. They recommend the abolition of the office of Superintendent of Indian affairs in the West, and that their duties be performed by Inspectors; Territorial government for the Indian Territory; establishment of courts; abolition of tribal sovereignty; extension of the criminal laws of the United States over the Indian reservations; exaction of individual responsibility from Indians for his acts. They invoke the powers of the Department of Justice for the punishment of the Indian Ring, and deal roughly with the contractors of the West The report covers many columns and is unani-
