The discussion of the Spanish Cabinet's reply, to what is called in the late Madrid telegram, the Washington Note, has reference to the unsettled uestions between the two countries. The statement of them being free from the verbiage of correspondence and presented in a comparatively brief memorandum. The exact points of this official paper cannot be ascertained. but they may be inferred from the views of the President which form the basis of instructions to Minister Cushing, and which show that the President regards the civil dissentions in Cuba. and especially the sanguinary hostili-ties which have been prevailing there for the last seven years, as producing effects in the Unites States second in gravity only to those which they pro-duce in Spain. Meantimeour political the Porte to fulfill his promises. relation to Cuba is altogether anomalous, seeing that for any injury done to the United States or her citizens in Cuba, we have no direct means of redress there and can obtain it only by slow and circuitous action by way of madrid. The ultimats issue of events in Cuba will be its independence, however that issue may be produced, whether by means of negotiation, or as the result of military operations, or of one of those unexpected incidents which so frequently determine the fate of nations. The continuance of the insurrection grows day by day more unsupportable to the United States, and while the attention of this Government is fixed on Cuba in the Madrid. The ultimate issue of events Government is fixed on Cuba in the interest of humanity, by the horrors of civil war prevailing there, it cannot forbear to reflect that the existence of slave labor in Cubs, and its influence over the feelings and interests of the over the feelings and interests of the Peninsula Spaniards, lie at the foundation of all the calamities which now affect the Island. The President has not been without hope that all these questions might be settled by the spontaneous act of Spain herself, she being more deeply interested in such a statement, than all the rest of the world.
