#### Election News—Tweed's Suit.

New York, Nov. 3.—Kings county gives Bigelow 6,922.

Shure, Rep., for Mayor of Brooklyn, is elected by 1,000 majority.

The World says the State will be close. We claim it by about 5,000.

The Legislature will be very close. We claim the Assembly. The Senate must be determined by faller returns.

Morrissey's majority is estimated at 3,500.

The Times editorially congratulates the Republicans on the result, and says that Tilden, as a Presidential candidate, has destroyed himself, and it is now beyond doubt, that both Republicans and Democrats will have to place new candidates before the people next year if they wish to succeed. Grant has long been out of the question as a Presidential candidate, and now Gov. Tilden may safely make up his mind to close his public life with his present term of office. No one need fear that the Republican success will revive the Third Term, as that is as dead as Julius Cæsar.

The latest returns at hand leave the State in doubt, with chances rather in favor of Bigelow. The majority is not likely to exceed 5,000 either way. The counties estimated this morning show where the Democratic returns increase, and where the Republican majority correspondingly decrease.

The Republicans have certainly a fair working majority in both Houses of the Legislature.

The Senate will stand about 2 Republicans to 11 Democrats. Assembly 78 Republicans to 53 Democrats.

The result on the State ticket is close and still a matter of doubt.

Advisors from Panama state that ex-President Stei is under arrest. Bandits attempted to assassinate the Governor and other officials at San Juan del Norte. The Governor was shot in the shoulder, his wife and daughter both being wounded. The Governor has resigned, the British Vice-Consul taking charge of affairs.

Motion has been granted by the Supreme Court to strike out the \$6,000,000 suit against Tweed, on the ground that the amended answer had been served within twenty days after the case was notified for trial.

#### VIRGINIA.

#### Frauds—County Returns.

RICHMOND, Nov. 4.—Jas. McDougal, registrar, and John Martinson, judge at the first precinct, have been arrested on the charge of fraud, in returning the vote of their precinct, whereby it is claimed that Knight, Independent candidate for the Senate, was beaten by Gen. Bradley Johnson, the Conservative nominee. James S. Morrison was also arrested on a criminal charge of misdirecting voters. They were all bailed in the sum of \$5,000 each.

If the charge of fraud is established at this precinct, and the vote thrown out, Johnson will lose his election.

County returns are still light, but enough has been received to show that the complexion of the Legislature will not be materially changed.

Independent candidates were voted for in a number of counties, but only in a few instances with successful results.

Carolina county elects Swann, Con. and J. H. White, Ind., for the House, Culpeper county elects Halle, Ind., over Brothier, Con.

Henrico county elects Talley, Rep., over Bryan, Con.

In Augusta county A. H. H. Starnut runs for the House as Independent. It is thought probable he is elected.

#### WASHINGTON.

#### Freedman's Bank—Fast Mail.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—The Commissioners of the Freedman's Savings Bank say they will continue to pay the 20 per cent. dividend, until every depositor has received his proper proportion, but they cannot possibly adjust more than five hundred accounts per day, of which there are over sixty thousand.

The Post Office Department has made arrangements for an additional daily fast mail between New York and the West. The limited mail train will still be dispatched from New York.
