PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 9.—Harran's official majority is 14,150.

CALIFORNIA.

NAX FRANCISCO, Nov. 9.—Henry L. Kelly, only survivor of the steamship Pacific, floated on the pilot house from 8:30 Thursday night to 10 o'clock Saturday morning. His companion died from exposure and was lost by jelly.

MISSOURI.

St. Louis, Nov. 7.—In the U. S. District Court yesterday, a petty jury was sworn in, after which, J. R. Witt, against whom two indictments were pending for conspiracy against the Government, and defending the Government, withdrew his plea of not guilty, and entered a plea of guilty to both indictments. The Grand Jury made a partial report returning indictments against two parties already indicted.

MARYLAND.

BALTIMORE, Nov. 9.—The third annual meeting of the American Health Association convened to-day. Between thirty and forty members were present. The Introductory address was delivered by Dr. Toner, president of the Association.

MASSACHUSETTS.

BOSTON, Nov. 9.—Intelligence has been received here of the supposed loss of the brig J. W. Spencer, which sailed from New York Sept. 11th, bound to Charleston, S. C. Twenty-four hours after she sailed the terrible hurricane commenced which caused so much damage, and it is feared the brig was lost with all on board.

WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—The Governing Committee of the Washington Stock Exchange this afternoon adopted a resolution, that in view of the opinion of the U. S. Attorney-General concerning the 3-65 District bonds, that the United States themselves authorized the issue of these bonds to secure their own debt—they shall hereafter be recognized and classed in all transactions of the Exchange, as bonds of the United States.

Alois Bell, of New York, has been appointed Chief Clerk of the Interior Department.

TEXAS.

GALVESTON, Nov. 9.—The City of Waco arrived here yesterday from New York, and anchored outside with the fleet of vessels at 1 p.m. Shortly after she was discovered to be on fire, the passengers and crew being compelled to take to open boats to save their lives.

FOREIGN.

ENGLAND.

LONDON, Nov. 9.—Reports confirm the dispatch to the effect that the Egyptian Government has applied to England for two experts to examine into and arrange its finances.

ITALY.

ROME, Nov. 9.—The Turkish Ambassador in this city has been summoned to Constantinople to assume there the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He favors the reforms recommended by Russia, Austria and North Germany.

Recently the Diario Espanol gave publication to the statement that the note has been dispatched from the Vatican to Spain insisting upon the execution of the Concordat, attributing the civic war to religious tolerance, and demanding that the Bishop of Urgel be tried by Ecclesiastical judges;
