WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—There are contradictory opinions regarding Mr. Wilson's condition this morning. He was re-lying during the night and had spasmodic extension of the arms. Whiskey and opiates have been injected under the skin. He is now drowsy and indisposed to conversation. Dr. Baxter said at 11 o'clock he was rising more comfortably and thinks he will recover. Mr. Wilson himself said he felt more natural.

Attorney-General Pierpont has decided that the act of Congress of April 27, 1816, conferring on Hugh and John Maxwell the grant of thirty six thousand acres at the fork of Black river, Missouri, made to President Maxwell in 1793 by the Spanish government. This large tract of land is situated in Reynolds and Iron county, Missouri, and is therefore declared to belong to the claimants, represented here by Warwick Tonstelt.

Wm. W. Civille, chief clerk in the general land office has resigned.

Wm. G. Biley, of Virginia, has been appointed consul to Zanzibar.

The President returned this morning. At one o'clock Mr. Wilson was shaved and dropped into a quiet sleep and slept until ten o'clock. Dr. Baxter expects to have him out in a day or two.
