DEATH OF PLATO DURHAM. Capt. Plato Durham died at his home in Shelby, on Tuesday morning, after a brief illness.

Coming into prominence as a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1868, he endeared himself to the people of the State by his services in that body, and especially by his bold and able fight against the corruption of the dominant party by which our State was ruled. No one of the small but gallant band of Democrats in that Legislature did more to expose the frauds and wrongs which were being perpetrated in the name of the State, and none left with so great a hold upon the public.

His political errors since we know were caused by the efforts to save those against whom the Government had directed its blows for participation in the Ku Klux troubles which prevailed in that section.

His last public service was in the recent Constitutional Convention. The people of North Carolina will long hold in grateful remembrance the services of Captain Durham in the Convention of 1868, and the Legislature which followed, when almost single-handed, he had the courage to fight corrupt power, when fear and policy closed the mouths of others. The great popularity and influence he maintained at home through all his political troubles, shows the character of the man and the confidence which his neighbors had in him. Forgetting all else the people of North Carolina will long remember the debt of gratitude which they owe to him.
