### PENNSYLVANIA.

PHILADRIPHIA, Nov. 24,-A move ment is af not to assemble a large number of soldiers of the late war in this city some time during the Centennial. It is proposed to have the Northern and Southern armies represented by their leading Generals, and a 1,000 rank and file from each State. The purpose is to show the world, by a grand impressive demonstration, that men who were in arms against each other a few years ago, are now united in celebrating the 100th birthday of their country.

# WASHINGTON.

Washington, Nov. 24. Indian Agent Irvine telegraphs, that in a recent alterestion at the Cameron Agen y, he was wounded in the hand by an Indian, and who, in attempting to escape, was shot by the guard, and that hostilities might be looked for at any moment. His wound prevents him from taking an active part in the difficulty. He recommends that the affairs be placed in the hands of a military commissioner.
Official information shows, that in

consequence of war with the natives, the Liberians in the interior are on the verge of starvation.

The Secretary of State has issued an order to the diplomatic and consular offices to display their flugs at half-mast, and adopt the usual symbols of mourning for thirty days.
