ILLINOIS.

CHICAGO, Dec. 28.—The Times has information that District Attorney Bangs has received instructions from Washington to allow all parties under indictment here for defrauding the Government, to plead guilty, and waive their immunity from the penitentiary.

WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 28.—The Signal Service officer at Sandy Hook reports that the bark reported shore this morning is the "Gentoo," Captain Staples, from Calcutta Aug. 22, for New York. She is on a stone pile. He also reports that the schooner Kate Bentfield reported ashore on the 26th, is off and in tow of the wrecking steamer Samana.

No meeting of the cabinet to-day, and unless something special occurs, there will be none this week.

The retirement of \$644,550 legal tender has been ordered on account of the National Bank circulation issued during the month. The outstanding legal tenders now ready are \$372,000,000.

Theodore M. Vale will succeed Col. Bangs as Superintendent of the Railway Mail Service. Bangs' resignation takes effect in February.

NEW YORK.

URICA, Dec. 28.—Mary Davis, upon whom sentence of death was pronounced, and her son were condemned to death, is to die on the 31st for murdering an aged cripple. She confesses that she was falsely at the trial. She and her grandmother, Mrs. Fredenberg, committed the murder.

New York, Dec. 28.—Frank Moulton has instituted suit against Henry Ward Beecher for \$50,000 damage. The complainant sets forth a malicious prosecution. Mrs. Tilson will be a witness.

A special to the Herald from London says the officials in Madrid having refused to forward the following dispatch, it was transmitted to this city through another source: "There are indications of the near advent of a serious diplomatic complication. There is a strange rumor afloat in trustworthy quarters which alleges the near arrival of European intervention in Cuba. The nations which may coalesce for this purpose are not named. The United States Government is probably forewarned of the fact, as I am assured that hasty dispatches in cipher are passing between Madrid and Washington."

ELECTRICISMS.

A broken rail threw the train on the Vermont Central Railroad off the track. Two Pullman and one passenger car were thrown down an embankment. None killed. Several seriously hurt.

The steamer Minnesota from Cincinnati to Memphis struck a snag forty miles above the latter place. She filled and turned over in a few minutes. No lives lost.

Lewis D. Crenshaw, of Richmond, is dead, aged 58.
