NEW YORK.

New York, Dec. 29.—Rev. Henry Bothem, better known as Father Both, em, the oldest prescher of the Methos dist church in this country and probably the oldest elergyman in the world, died yesterday at the house of his granddaughter, near Richmond, Staten Islaud. On the 8th of last June, the one hundredth anniversary of his birth was edebrated at Jersey City by the Newark Conference, when Father Bothem submitted an outline of his own life and labors in the Methodist church, and addresses were made by church, and addresses were made by other clergymen. The excitement of the occasion prostrated him and though he rallied, he was again soized with liness on the 12th of this month while stempting to preach in the village huron at Bichmond, Staten Island. He was born in Laucaster county, Pa, He joined the Methodist church in 1797: He served in the ministry in Peonsylvania, Delaware and Maryland Pages yivania, Delaware and Maryland and was the travelling companion of Bishop Asbury. For more than thirty years Father Bothem has been in the New Jersey Conference and as early as 1842, was on the list of supernumerary preschers. He was buried on Friday.
