The Fall of Fort Fisher, and Evacuation of Fort Caswell and Fort Smithville, N. C.

At the time Porter's powerful armada, the heroic in point of naval the world had ever seen, appeared the second time of Fort Fisher, there was in that monument of Whiting's engineering genius a mere handful of men untried in battle but under the command of the gallant Colonel William Lamb, and there he gathered the near entire strength of the garrison.

When the enemy landed without opposition, on the night of the 13th of January, '65, some three miles above Fisher, the magnificent division of Hoke was encamped a mile back of Wilmington, at least twenty-one miles from the Fort. It was too late when the news arrived to retrieve the mistake that had been committed by the commander of the department.

When the news arrived that the Fort had fallen, the brave tars at Fort Buchanan played their guns upon the enemy, and it was fully 3 P. M. when the naval officer, Lieutenant-at-Pamlico Jones, left Buchanan's Yankees having already entered.

It was a beautiful Sunday morning, the heavens in striking contrast with the war of passions going on beneath them—for men were being murdered in defiance of their country.
