BREAKING GROUND. The campaign in this State commenced at Shelby, Cleveland county, on Saturday last the 17th inst. Gov. Jarvis and Attorney General Kenan addressed a large crowd of the good citizens of Cleveland and adjoining counties.

Col. Kenan also made one of his happiest efforts and was frequently interrupted by applause. He discussed exhaustively the subject of education and the increasing demand for a better and higher system.

On the same day an immense crowd assembled at Concord, Cabarrus county. Twelve hundred people were present at the ratification meeting in Allison's grove and were addressed at noon and after night, by Maj. Dowd, the democratic candidate for Congress, General J. M. Leach, F. H. Busbee and Col. John N. Staples.

The campaign has commenced under the most favorable auspices. The enthusiasm which has greeted our candidates in the West and Centre, is most gratifying—most encouraging—and destined to spread with rapidity from the Mountains to the seaboard.

On the 1st Thursday in August the democrats of Wilson county will hold primary elections to name candidates for the county. We desire to state that the name of Dr. J. M. Taylor, our present representative, will be before the people for renomination to the Legislature.
