**A GOOD LESSON.**  
The hearing of four men at Chicago last Friday means far more than the execution of four men ordinarily does. It means that this is a country of law and order. It means that the people who live in America and live by its soil and its institutions of freedom, do not propose that a band of lawless devils shall overturn our institutions and establish a reign of terror. Believing this to be the significance of the execution of the four anarchists, we rejoice greatly to know that the maudlin sentimentality that endeavored to win the pardon of the exponents of the doctrine of blood and lawlessness, were unsuccessful. This is a country where honest, industrious men, of whatever nationality, are at liberty to cast their lot with ours and become Americanized. America is the land of freedom, and it is not the land of license. The lesson taught by the execution of a few yards of hemp, will, we truly hope, have a beneficial effect upon many of the un-Americanized inhabitants of that portion of the green earth known as America.

**JUDGMENT AFFIRMED.**  
The clerk of the Superior Court of Guilford county refused to qualify the appointees of Governor Scales for magistrates in that county. The case was and the clerk ordered to qualify before Judge Shepherd. He, acting under the guidance of the North State, took an appeal to the Supreme Court. The case has been decided and the judgment of the lower court affirmed. The patriot did good work in showing up the attempt of these Republicans to violate the law of the State for political purposes. The decision of the highest court shows that these political tricksters that the laws of the State are not made merely to be obeyed when it suits convenience or interest, but that they are laws in reality, as well as in name. The decision is what everybody expected, but it has given the Republicans, led by the North State, a black eye.

**OUR WASHINGTON LETTER.**  
The News From the Nation's Capital as Reported by Our Regular Correspondent.  
WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 14 '87.  
General Sparks, Commissioner of the General Land Office, has at last been called upon to resign after receiving the severest reprimand ever administered by a superior officer to a subordinate. He undertook to criticize Secretary Lamar's decisions, and to dictate to him how he should administer the affairs of his Department, and the Secretary in righteous indignation expressed in one of the sharpest and most dignified letters ever addressed by one official to another, in which he told the Commissioner that he proposed to administer the Department according to law, and precedent, and in the substance that the Commissioner did not understand even the elementary principles of law, closed by saying, "that it is due to an orderly and decorous administration of the Government, to important public interests, and the confidence placed in Mr. Gillespie's school in this department was especially attractive. There are other exhibitors who deserve special mention, but we have not the space to permit us to do so. In Agricultural Hall the display was very meager. The rains have washed up so many of the bridges leading to Tarboro that the large exhibits that would have filled this department were necessarily prevented from being on hand. The restaurant under the grand stand was conducted by the ladies for the benefit of the Methodist church. We are pleased to know that they met with success—that they cleared a nice sum for the church. The pleasure of a Fair, to our mind, is to meet the men and talk with them. We were all in love with the pretty girls, to watch the people generally and enjoy whatever comes—rain or shine. Judged by this standard the Tarboro Fair was certainly one of the most pleasant occasions that we have enjoyed in a long time.

Dr. J. J. Pittman, the president, Mr. Jeffrey, the Secretary, did their utmost to make the Fair a success and its friends certainly owe them a debt of gratitude. The Hotel Farrar is a house that is getting to be proud of, and we noticed with pleasure, the pride that the people of the town feel in this monument to the public spirit of Mr. Farrar.

The merchants of Tarboro appeared to be moderately happy and hopeful. They are doing well in the market, about the business usually done there in the fall.
