Decided the Purchase Void.
ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 21.—Judge Emory Spear, presiding in the United States Circuit Court, for the Southern District of Georgia has certified that the purchase in the interest of the Central Railroad of Georgia, of the franchises of the Savannah and Dublin Railway Company is void, because contrary to the provision of the constitution of Georgia, prohibiting any corporation from purchasing the stock of any other, or making any contract which would have the effect of defeating competition or creating monopoly. It is thought that the decision may have an adverse bearing upon recent consolidation of railroad interests in this State.
