

to cause a great deal of trouble and which would have caused more in the future. Really there were two cases, one being that against the Raleigh & Gaston railway and the other that against the Seaboard & Roanoke railway, both being for taxes. The Federal Court gave judgement against the latter for \$67,500 being the sum due tor taxes on 14,000 shares, at 20 cents a share, from 1866 to 1892. Against the former road there was no judgment, the State and Federal Courts both having decided that its charter gave it absolute exemption from taxation. But, in the interests of peace and harmony the officers of both roads have come forward and made an agreement or compromise with Gov. Holt, the Railway Commission and the State Treasurer, whereby the Raleigh &


