

A BRUTAL MURDER.

A German and His Wife Killed and Their

House Fired. MARIETTA, O., January 14 .- Henry Saner, a respectable German and his wife were murdered last night in their ome, near Pinchtown, four miles north, and their son is missing. Their barn was burned and the house had been set on fire, but neighbors arrived in time to extinguish the blaze. Mr. nd Mrs. Saner lay full length on the kitchen floor. Their clothing was

burned from their bodies, having been saturated with oil. The neighbors out out the blaze and saved the bodies

and the house from destruction.
