Many of them having sufficient suf plus of other products to carry them through another crop year," and a consequence they are "less dependent on that crop than they have been formerly," and "are better able to hold for an improvement in the market." That their condition is improving "is beyond question," and

"that the improvement is due mainly -perhaps solely-to a withdrawal of obsolute dependence on cotton is equally certain. The wisdom of their conduct, it need only be added, is best proved by its comfortable results. Another particularly suggestive statement is that "cotton is the only price." We believe this is true, and that the fact has not received the attention from the farmers and their numerous advisers which it deserves. Cotton is certainly excessively low and has been for several years-so low that farmers generally assert that it cannot be produced at a profit at existing prices. It is lower now than it has been in fifty years, we are told, and there is little prospect of its ever going much higher. We know of ho other agricultural products of the South that are in as bad condition. The prices of most of them are "low," of course, as compared with the highest prices recorded for them, but nearly all prices have been reduced together in recent years. The point that is made is that the price of cotton alone is extraordinarily low-so low as to make the product unprofitable, and so much we believe cannot be said of anything else.
