

NEW RAILROAD SYSTEM

CONNECTING THE SOUTH WITH THE NORTH AND WEST.

There is now talk of another big railroad deal which is to connect the South with the North and West and the South-Bound Road, now being constructed in this State, is to be one of the connecting links.

Starting from Savannah, Ga., it will have connection over the Savannah, Florida and Western Railroad into Florida; thence moving North, it intersects the South Carolina Railway at Lee's on its way to Columbia, and then to Monroe, N.C., via the Three C's where it intersects the Georgia, Carolina and Northern Road.

It is generally thought that John Robinson, of the Seaboard Air Line, is thinking of securing a port on the South Atlantic coast, but principally to establish a quick line between the North and South.

The railroad situation is certainly a most interesting one, particularly at this time. Those roads which are not already under the control of some of the many gigantic syndicates are practically on the market.
