COLLECTION OF TAXES.

FROM PERSONS WHO HAVE REMOVED FROM PLACE OF LIVING

An act was passed, making it the duty of the sheriff and tax collector of a county, city or town, whenever he is informed that a taxpayer has removed from his county, city or town without paying the taxes listed for that year, to make enquiry to where the taxpayer has removed, and in the settlement of the sheriff or tax collector he shall state under oath that he has made faithful enquiry for the location of all taxpayers who have removed from his county, city or town owing tax for the fiscal year, or the same shall be charged to him and not be allowed in his insolvent list, and if any officer has not complied with any law to enforce collection of taxes at all times he shall be charged with the same.

After making enquiry, if the officer finds that the taxpayer who has removed from his county, city or town without paying his taxes listed for that year, and has no property known to the collecting officer, he shall make a report of the same with a return of the tax receipt to the register of deeds who shall make out a certificate that the taxes were listed for that year, that the same are due and reported unpaid by the collecting officer.

The officer shall send the receipt and certificate to the collection officer of the county, city or town to which the taxpayer has removed, and the same shall be a tax list in his hands for the collection of said taxes.

The tax collecting officer to whom the tax receipt has been sent, shall proceed to the collection of the taxes and shall report his proceedings to the officer from whom he received the tax receipt, within sixty days.

If the taxpayer is insolvent and the taxes cannot be collected the officer shall return the tax receipt under his oath that he has used due diligence in making the collection by levy, garnishment or otherwise, and that the taxpayer is insolvent, otherwise he shall be liable on his bond for the taxes to be collected in a suit.
