Early in 1862. Mr. Gregory was elected itermenant and continued to discharge the duties devolving upon him until the battle of Cold Hather, which battle was fought with desperation by the contending stmles on the 27th of June 1862. Late in the afternoon of that day Cal (Wad), commander of the regiment, approached him on the battlefield and sold: "Licottenant Gregory, we have had a hard and shoody fight and have graned a glorous vistary. I have been near you and your sheady nght and need feel proud of the latter's fighting qualities. We are now without an adjutant; for your meritorious conduct on the batil-field I now appoint you adjutant of the regiment. Enter upon your duties at once."

at the close of the war his commission as adjutant ranked among the older, in the Army of Northern Virginia. He was in many disperate struggles and was taken prisoner at Spottsylvania on the 12th of July 1864. He was taken to Point Lookont and from thence to Fort Delaware and was released on the 7th of June, 1865.


