Items of Interest From All Sections of the State.

G. A. Garon will build and operate a chair factory at Lexington.

The Reformed Church of Salisbury has received a handsome new pipe organ.

Southern Pines has a new industry, the manufacture of violins by A. N. Roberts.

The next State Fair will be continued for two weeks instead of the usual four days.

The number of students at the University of North Carolina is now 7,000 which breaks the record.

Rev. O. B. Samsell, colored, of High Point, has been found over to court under a bond of \$500, charged with practicing medicine without license.

Rev. J. H. Nelson, of Caldwell county, informs the Lenoir Topic that his son, Lawrence, disappeared about two weeks ago, and he cannot get any clue as to his whereabouts.

Cooper Harris, a young white man of Pittsboro, has been bound over to court under a bond of \$200, on the charge of cutting George Booker, a merchant of that place.

Salem will celebrate two anniversaries in November. One will commemorate the first settlement of the town in 1708, and the other the dedication of the present Home Moravian Church.

At Shaw University, colored, a large brick building is under construction to be used for the industrial work of the college, at which there are now 550 students, representing about 10 States.

Zimmerman & Lester, of Winston, has awarded the contract for the North Carolina building at the Jamestown Exposition. The building will be of colonial design and the cost is not to exceed \$15,000.

Col. Fred A. Olds, of Raleigh, has received a very interesting relic of the war of 1812, which will be placed in the State Museum. It is a coat worn during the war by the father of the late Governor Brogden. It is of navy blue, and is slightly moth eaten. With this slight exception, it is in a good state of preservation.
